ADOPTIVE PARENT(S) HAVE THE RIGHT:

To have any information you share with Family Resources, Inc. staff person to make sure all service activities are integrated and coordinated.

To know that the services you receive will be kept on file by Family Resources, Inc. staff.

To participate in the development of your case plan.

To choose which service activities will help you meet your goals.

To work with your Family Resources, Inc. staff person to make sure all service activities are integrated and coordinated.

To raise any concerns you have about the progress, content and outcomes of services provided. If you are still not satisfied, you have the right to access Family Resources, Inc.'s grievance process, which will be explained to you in that event.

To know any court, legal or funder limitations on your services and the consequences of lack of compliance with these limitations.

To refuse to accept Family Resources, Inc. services or a specific component of service. Family Resources, Inc. staff will inform you of any consequences of your refusal, including whether your refusal will make it impossible for Family Resources, Inc. to continue to provide services to you.

To have information provided in a form that is understandable to you.

You have the right to receive professional and competent services, and to be treated with dignity.

You have the right to receive Family Resources, Inc.'s policy regarding financial responsibilities, including the fee policy.

You have the right to receive a list of the names and addresses of the Agency's Board of Directors.

You have the right to receive copies of all documents you may be asked to sign.

You have the right to receive a copy of all documents you have signed.

You have the right to know that all staff and social workers adhere to the NASW Code of Ethics and are legal mandatory reporters of child abuse.
