Report from Initiative Teams:

Prevention: The Prevention Team is working on an overall campaign to promote child abuse prevention and resiliency in the community. Will likely be a paper campaign and additional efforts will be made to address the specific findings in the community assessment and objectives are still being developed.

Early Childhood: ECE has decided to be most effective if we will start by developing training specifically for early childhood directors/administrators/etc. at programs. We anticipate working with local CCR&R to develop an event to engage them in these efforts. From there we would like to find an effective way to train front line staff-

method to be determined. In the meantime we will work on getting the community trainings offered approved for ECE credit for providers who are able to attend.

Community Education: An official Training Schedule has been developed and was introduced at the Consortium meeting. These trainings are free and will be posted on the Family Resources website. There will be one every month, on each side of the river, and one every quarter in the evening. Please call or email Mindy to register for these trainings. The Community Education Team will work on getting these approved for ECE provider credit. The Team is also looking into ways to engage faith community leaders. We are trying to find the best way to engage this community in a training effort.

Universal Screening: The Universal Screening Team is currently working on first gathering information on who is screening and what they are screening for. When information developed a plan will be put in place for how to support additional screening efforts.

Civic Services: The Civic Services Team will be piloting an initiative at the Friendly House food pantry. All volunteers will receive the TIC/ACES training. Data will be gathered on feedback from participants and staff to determine how training impacts their experience. If the pilot goes well the plan is to provide a similar project to all QC Food Pantry Volunteers in Scott and Rock Island Counties.

Data: The Data Team is working to measure the long term outcomes of ACEs and Trauma Informed Care work. The Team has made initial contact with the University of Iowa, Institute for Clinical and Translational Science for consulting purposes on measuring community “impact.”

School Districts: The School Districts Team is identifying representation from both Scott and Rock Island Counties and working to reach out to all. This Team is also beginning to identify strategies to move the ACEs study into the education settings.

Marketing: The Marketing Team is working on developing messages to share with each team and a potential toolkit for distribution. This team will develop a clear mission statement for the whole consortium. They distributed “I Have, I Am, I Can” handouts to the room and asked team captains to please have their teams complete and return to Nicole (Nicolenicklin@msn.com) at their next meeting so they can support efforts.

Medical/Health: The Health Team is working to identify health and medical community members needed on the Team. This team is also exploring opportunities and ideas to develop strategies for moving the ACEs and TIC information into this sector of our community.

Resource Development: The Resource Development Team is exploring all options for funding community need areas that will begin to emerge and be identified from the Initiative Teams. This Team is also working to identify additional team members from different parts of the community.

Organizational Competency: The Organizational Competency Team has developed a pilot group of cohort agencies who have volunteered to go through the organizational assessment review process together. Cohort agencies will meet once per month to review one Domain of the CCTIC Creating Cultures of Trauma Informed Care Self-Assessment Scale (or **FHSA Tool** for short). This process should take approximately 6-7 months. Organizations using additional assessment tools are also welcome to join a cohort.

What **Action Steps** will be taken before the next meeting?
